All Wrapped Up - Digger's Vintage 2008

*Well I guess it will not come to you as a surprise when I say the theme this year is **HOT, HOT, HOT.***

The 2008 Vintage has been tough; the climate challenges we continue to faced are without doubt intense. This vintage has had good and bad points, testing the ability to carry on with concept and endure the barriers to still make wine as you would like.

When I started Diggers' my Dad said there is one important thing to remember; "If you plan to make 60 tonne a year, build a 100 tonne winery and run it 60% full". In this extreme year, this advice has proven invaluable. We were able to pick and process our wine in 3-4 weeks when in a cooler climate we would take 8-10 weeks and still had no real pressure on our chilling due to fermentation being done in a temperature controlled environment.

We did have one down fall this year, our G10 Zambelli Press blew a seal early in the season and after much effort, we realised that we could not find parts or a repairer who would deal with such a menial task. Fortunately Dad came along and said he had an old press in the back shed. We discarded the 1960's technology and went back to a press designed in the 1800's. She was the original press from Rovalley Wines of Rowland Flat now restored. She served the old boys well and is the best press I have ever had the pleasure of using.

2005 Top Dog – Shiraz

The Top Dog Shiraz 2005 was bottled at the End of December 2007, hand packaging was completed at the end of March 2008. The Top Dog Shiraz 2005 is now ready for sale.

Tim's Notes;

I love Grenache in the Barossa for its ability to survive in hard conditions. Another great survivor is Shiraz and is equally natural to the Barossa's harsh conditions. This gave me the desire to put out a straight Shiraz. So here is the Top Dog, it is wine from old Shiraz, dry grown, I guess you have heard this before, but this is a special section of vineyard.

Made in a slightly different style, it is reasonably high in alcohol, but the alcohol is disguised with huge fruit flavours and some of the best oak characteristics available.

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
